### 1 Questions for the final lesson

### on General Psychopathology (first module)

1. Sections of psychiatry. Issues of taxonomy of mental disorders. Classification of mental and behavioral disorders according to ICD-10.

2. The main stages of development of psychiatry.

3. Issues of organization of psychiatric and drug treatment in Ukraine.
